- One-page roadmap (PDF) for educators regarding pediatrics in the pre-clerkship curriculum (attached).


Goals/Objectives over the next year:

Why Pediatrics?

Making the Argument: Problem Identification & Needs Assessment

All Medical Students:

- Enhance residency readiness (every residency other than IM has a pediatric component)
- Enhance understanding of ACEs, chronic illness, neurodevelopmental disorders
- Build skills in complex communication, observation as PE skill, and family-centered care
- Teach widely applicable content including health equity, SDoH, advocacy, sex and gender minority health, vaccines, climate and health, substance use

Pediatric Workforce: To enhance clerkship readiness and meaningful roles, increase exposure to pediatric mentors and experiences (research, advocacy, service, clinical), enhance understanding of the breadth of pediatric careers

Action Steps for Pediatric Educators

Participate in pre-clerkship teaching opportunities: enhance y knowledge of the curriculum to identify opportunities for pediatric content and educators and expose students to more pediatricians.

Don't limit yourself to pediatric-focused content: pediatricians have expertise in widely-applicable content (communication, traumainformed care, health equity, advocacy, climate & health, and more!).

Join curricular committees: contribute to the conversations around curricular change and step up for opportunities.

Build relationships with curricular leaders: become the "go-to" person for pediatric content and reach out to them with ideas and innovations.

Support student-led efforts: partner with them to advocate for curricular change.

Network with colleagues outside of your institution: learn from successes, share resources, and collaborate.
